

# Legal action against board moving forward

In a phone interview with John Barga, lawyer for those wishing to save the old high school, Barga said things are moving ahead.

"We served a request for documents," said Barga. Those public documents include e-mails, letters, electronic transmissions, board resolutions, board minutes, appraisals, contractor estimates and other documents relating to the demolition of the high school.

Counsel for the Galion board of education indicated they have received the request and will try to assemble the documents and records as soon as possible, Barga said.

After Barga reviews the documents, then he will decide if there will be a need for depositions of two or three people.
