## Hearing concerning demolition of old GHS postponed... again

The old Galion High School will have to wait yet again to find out if it will be demolished or not.

The preliminary injunction hearing concerning the fate of the old high school, scheduled for this past Tuesday at 10 a.m., was continued until Wednesday, March 5 at 10:30 a.m. The decision was filed Friday, Feb. 15 at 11:40 a.m. upon the request of both parties.

The case, titled State of Ohio Ex Rel, et. al. vs. Galion City Schools Board of Education, et. al., will be heard in front of Judge Russel Wiseman.

Oh Jan. 14, a group of citizens wishing, to stop demolition of the former Galion High School filed suit with the Galion board of education in hopes of stopping the process and saving the build-

ing. Persons named as plaintiffs are David E. Smith, Steven Kemle, Carole Kemle and Martha Palmer. Plaintiff's attorneys are John Barga and Eleanor Anderson.

Defendant's attorneys handling the case for the board of education are Steven .Fried-

man, David Smith and Kathryn Perrico.

"The District will incur cost related to the lawsuit," said district treasurer Linda Kidwell, "but we can't quantify the cost at this time because we don't know how long the lawsuit will last."
